From the Pastor's Desk

If you are interested in joining youth group, please arrive at 6:00 p.m. for dinner. Youth group starts at 6:30 p.m.

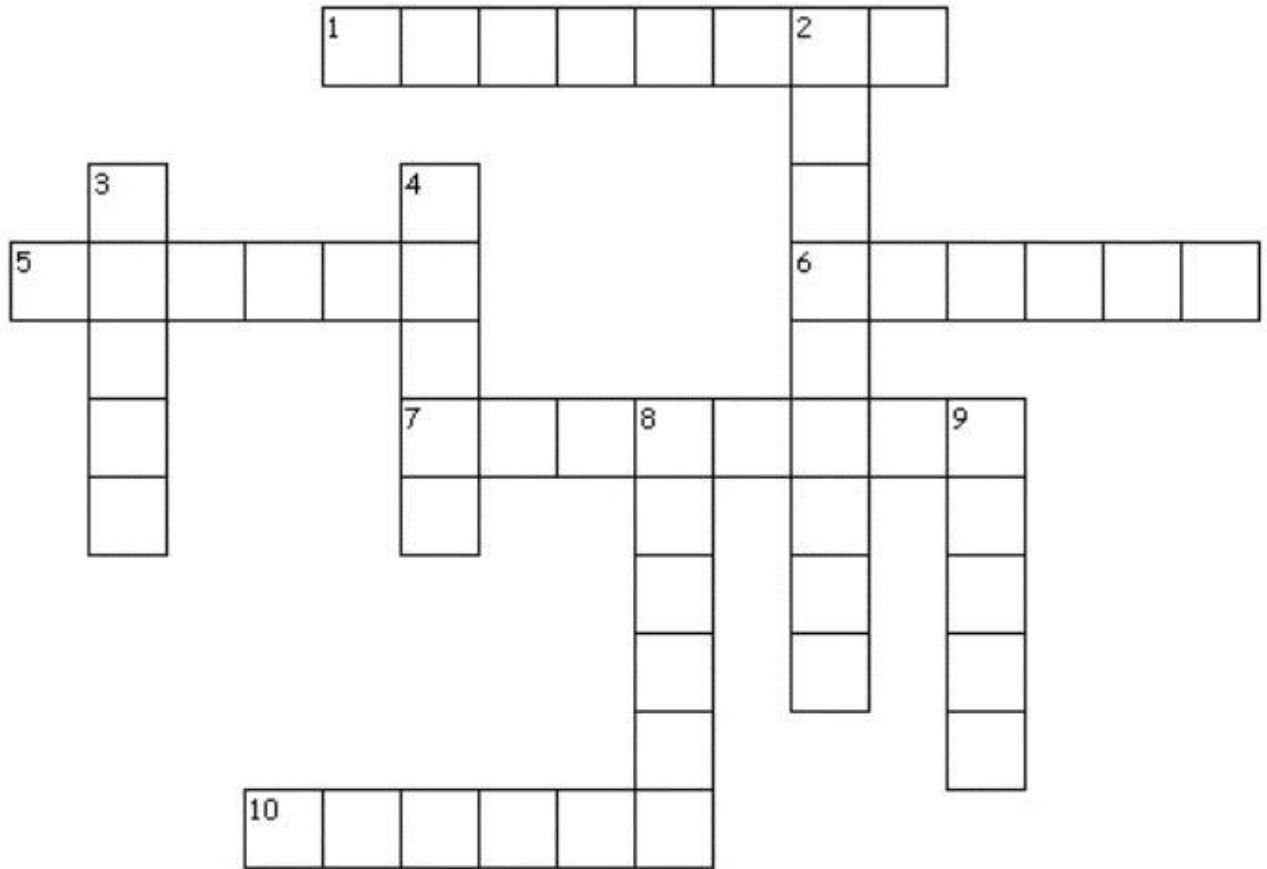

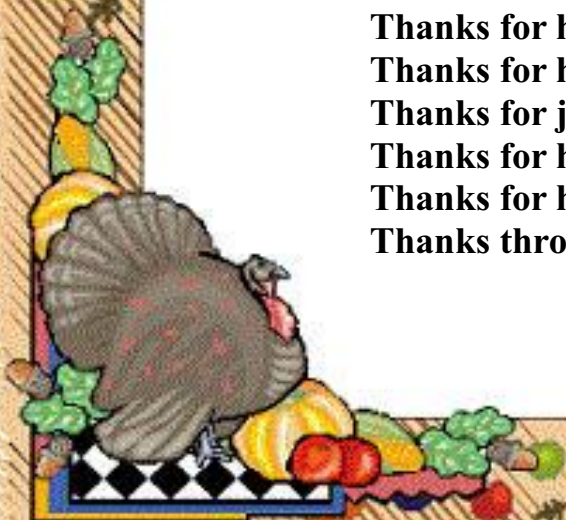
Thanks to God

A stated meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, MN was held at 6:40 PM in the Fellowship Hall of the church on September 6, 2016.

The meeting began at 6:40 PM when Dr. April Davis Campbell lit the Christ Candle to remind us that we have come together for a holy purpose and to be a light to the community. The “devotion” was led by Brenda. The Jacob Wetterling abduction/murder was the topic. She related her personal experiences with Patty Wetterling and family. Jerry Wetterling was recently in the paper for attending a Baha’i prayer event where the fact of Patty Wetterling’s Christianity was noted. Unity of people, unity of God, unity of religions – these are Baha’i tenets. The Wetterlings have done a great job at turning their personal tragedy into a positive for the rest of society. The meeting was then opened with prayer.

Clerk’s Report: The August Minutes were approved as submitted. Maxine Aaron died on August 30th. Ethel Thieling passed away on August 27th.

Treasurer’s Report: Cash is running low. Income in August was not abysmal, so there is a question about why we had such large expenses. Marcia needs to run a report to see what the treasurer has paid.

Foundation Report: Will be meeting on Sunday. Bob Albright says that we are doing okay with the investment fund results this year.

Pastor’s Report: The presbytery grant process is on-going. She wrote an article for the Hastings Gazette recently. Her monthly radio program continues as well. April will be gone 10/9 for her second Twin Cities Marathon. There will be a family trip to Nebraska during MEA break 10/23. She will also attend a Synod meeting in early October.

Presbytery Meeting: The Presbytery will meet in New Brighton next Tuesday. Dennis was elected as commissioner.

Committee Reports

Mission – Mary – The amount of school supplies collected was good. The Prayer Shawl Group tied blankets for Family Service/Meals-on-Wheels which were well received.

Stewardship/Finance – Marcia Rash – November 13th will be the receiving of pledge cards for 2017.

Worship – Special music is coming. M/S/C to have November service of unity before the election. Bell Choir will play in service soon. Upcoming dates for Informal Worship: September 25, October 30, and November 20. Brenda suggested making Advent Wreaths in November. The December 25th Informal Worship will be a Hymn Sing, in the sanctuary (and on the radio).

Personnel/Nominating – Karen Altpeter accepted another term on Session to begin in 2017.
