


Yard Sale





Session Minutes for November 1, 2016

A stated meeting of the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, MN was held at 6:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall of the church on November 1, 2016.

The meeting began at 6:30 PM when Reverend Dr. April Davis Campbell lit the Christ Candle to remind us that we are on sacred ground and are the keepers of the flock. The devotion was led by Mary. Mary talked about some of the changes in life (she is retiring at the end of this year). There is joy living in the present moment. I John 3:2 Beloved, we are God's children now. God's presence will calm us in the middle of our worldly cares. The meeting was then opened with prayer.

Clerk's Report: The October Minutes were approved as submitted. Annual reports will be starting.

Treasurer's Report: We need to update our accounting software, Quick Books. We will end the year about where we started with our check book.

Foundation Report: Still has not met.

Pastor's Report: The transitional presbytery executive may come to talk with us at informal worship on January 29. A draft of the pledge card was prepared. The elevator (technically a lift) has never been inspected. The inspector indicated that we need a pressure test on the hydraulic system. Need to find keys for the elevator and a secure place to keep them. An inspection was originally part of our permit to operate the lift. April has been searching for an advent wreath project for informal worship. Her second Twin Cities Marathon was successfully completed. A recent half marathon was completed in just over 2 hours which was a significant improvement. Her dad is finally out of ICU at Regions Hospital. He still has lost a lot of muscle mass. He remains on a feeding tube. April hopes for his continued strengthening. She is thankful for our understanding of the situation. Progress was made on a new sign on our existing footprint. A vendor proposal is a traditional sign employing LED lighting.

Presbytery Meeting: at House of Hope in St. Paul on November 15th. Dave and Grant are planning to attend that meeting.

Deacons: Christmas Caroling on December 11th.

M/S/C to receive all of the reports above on the consent agenda.

Stewardship/Finance – Marcia Rash – There will be a pot luck on November 13 to celebrate our stewardship. It is also Poinsettia Fundraiser time. Orders will be due 11/20/2016, too.

Worship – A Unity Service that will focus on healing after the divisiveness of the election season will be held on November 6 at 5 PM.

Personnel/Nominating – Contacting people, but not a lot of success yet.

New Business - None
